

The offices that are to be voted on are the follow (I have also included <u>brief description</u> of each office from Robert's Rule):

President. To open the session at the time at which the assembly is to meet, by taking the chair and calling the members to order: to announce the business before the assembly in the order in which it is to be acted upon; to recognize members entitled to the floor; to state and to put to all questions which are regularly moved, or necessarily arise in the course of the proceedings, and to announce the result of the vote: to inform the assembly, when necessary, or when referred to for the purpose, on a point of order or practice pertinent pending business; to

authenticate, by his signature, when necessary, all the acts, orders, and proceedings of the assembly declaring its will and in all things obeying its commands

Vice-President. If it is necessary for the President to be absence then the Vice President, if there is one, should take the chair and calling the members to order: to announce the business before the assembly in the order in which it is to be acted upon; to recognize members entitled to the floor; to state and to put to vote all questions which are regularly moved, or necessarily arise in the course of the proceedings, and to announce the result of the vote: to inform the assembly, when necessary, or when referred to for the purpose, on a

point of order or practice pertinent to pending business; to authenticate, by his signature, when necessary.

Secretary: The Secretary is the recording officer of the club, the custodian of records except such as are specifically assigned to others. as the Treasurer's books. In addition to keeping the records of the club the minutes of the meetings, it is the duty of the secretary to keep a register, and to sign with the President all orders on the Treasurer authorized by the society. 

Ready For Digital?

The ARRL received a request from the FCC asking that ARRL members to provide technical educational assistance to their communities concerning the FCC-mandated digital television DTV conversion scheduled for February 17, 2009.

According to ARRL Media and Public Relations Manager Allen Pitts, W1AGP, Amateur Radio clubs across the country are being asked to develop and implement

plans to provide information throughout January and February about the DTV conversion in their areas. The FCC is leaving it up to the clubs to decide how to do this, as local groups understand the communities in ways that the FCC does not. Each

community is a little different, Pitts said, so plans carried out by the clubs will vary from community to community. Interested groups should contact their ARRL Section Manager.

Pitts stressed that hams should not make "house calls," sell any equipment or do actual installations; the request is only to distribute technical information and FCC materials. He commented: "As we all know, some folks just never get the message until too late. Materials for presentations, education and many other activities are available online. Beginning early January, FCC staff will contact Section Managers and leaders of interested clubs and, where possible, arrange to meet to share even more information, audio, visual and printed materials, as well as and training aids, with the clubs involved this effort. We know the time is short, but your aid in this now will be appreciated."

In early January, Pitts said that the FCC would ask Section Managers for the names and contact information of the volunteering groups. The FCC staff will then make contact with the groups, learn their plans and provide them with the media, brochures or other materials groups may need in this effort. Materials also can be downloaded from the DTV Conversion Web site. FCC regional staff members may even come and visit with larger

groups to aid in implementation of the group's plans.

"I really appreciate the willingness of the ARRL to actively participate in helping Americans with the transition to DTV and your helpful suggestions," said George Dillon, FCC Deputy

Bureau Chief for Field Operations. "The DTV transition will be an historic moment in the evolution of TV. Broadcast television stations can offer viewers improved picture and sound quality and new programming choices. All digital broadcasting also will allow us to significantly improve public safety communications and will usher in a new era of advanced wireless services such as the widespread deployment of wireless broadband. Our goal is to engage the amateur community on a cooperative basis to help with the DTV outreach and to educate consumers."

Dillon continued that local Amateur Radio clubs might consider offering technical advice to consumers via telephone to those consumers who may encounter difficulty with the installation and setting up of their converter box. "Any assistance...will greatly help in the efforts of the FCC to ensure a smooth transition to DTV on February 17, 2009."

spondence of the society, except as otherwise provided. The Secretary should, previous to each meeting, for the use of the chairman, make out an order of business, showing in their exact order what is necessarily to come before the assembly. He should also have, at each meeting, a list of all standing committees, and such special committees as are in existence at the time, as well as the by-laws of the organization and its minutes.

Treasurer: The duties of this officer vary in different societies. In probably the majority of cases he acts as a banker, merely holding the funds deposited with him and paying them out on the order of the society signed by the president and the secretary. He is always required to make an annual report. If the society has auditors the report should be handed to them, with the vouchers, in time to be audited before the meeting. The auditors having certified to its correctness, submit their report, and the chair puts the question on adopting it, which has the effect of approving the Treasurer's report, and relieving him from responsibility in case of loss of vouchers, except in case of fraud. If there are no auditors the report when made should be referred to an auditing committee, who should report on it later.

It should always be remembered that the financial report is made for the information of members. The details of dates and separate payments for the same object are a hindrance to its being understood, and are useless, as it is the duty of the auditing committee to examine into details and see if the report is correct. The best form for these financial reports depends upon the kind of society, and is best determined by examining those made in similar societies. The following brief report is in a form adapted to many societies where the financial work is a very subordinate part of their work:

Q-MATCH

First Year Trustee. (from our bylaws)

The Trustees shall have the control and management of the property of the club, subject only by the action of the membership, audit the books of the corporation, conduct the annual meeting, and further duties as may required of them by the members.

The above description is not in any means complete for each office it is just a summary ...

CREAM SODA CAKE

1 box yellow cake mix

1 cup boiling water

1 small package strawberry Jell-O

1 (12 ounce) can cream soda

EMI has revised and updated the IS-700 course materials. Please begin using the IS-700.a materials immediately. If you have previously started the IS-700 course and need to take the final exam, you must complete the exam and obtain a passing score before February 13, 2009. After February 13, 2009, the IS 700 exam will no longer be available.

You may complete your exam online at http://training.fema.gov/index.asp. If you are completing your final exam for IS 700 via Op-Scan bubble sheets, they must be postmarked no later than Friday, February 13, 2009.

At this time there are no downloadable materials for IS 700.a but they are forthcoming.

FCC calls for Help cont'

Pitts advises interested groups to keep in mind that they are to provide technical educational help only: "At no time should the hams enter someone else's home or install equipment. They should not broker or sell conversion boxes in any way. Clubs can provide such things as a call-in telephone number for technical help, make presentations at meetings, do demonstrations at malls or give talks to other groups -- whatever works in their community."


