PAPER CHASE

Did you make the contacts to obtain the WAS (Worked All Steves) certificate I mentioned last month? I did not, only got two of them, so this month I have another certificate that you should easily obtain even though it requires contacting fifteen Museum Ships.

This year there is a new sponsor and a new date. The Battleship New Jersey (BB-62) Amateur Radio Station has replace the USS Salem (CA-139) Radio Club as the sponsor and the event will take place from 0000Z June 3rd through 2359 June 4th, 2006.

There are now 65 ships signed up to participate. There are 2 Aircraft Carriers, 6 Battleships, 3 Cruisers, 5 Destroyers and many many more. One of the interesting ones is the President's Yacht, USS Potomac, a Coast Guard Cutter. It is located in Oakland, California and will use the call sign KI6ASN. If you are a member of the International Light House Society, there will be 4 lightships in the event. With ships being sunk to form reefs for fish, none of these ships will be activated for IOTA.
